ENGLISH

Students will write a narrative inspired by a Fairy Tale explored in class. They will also write an information report linked to the history unit on family roles and responsibilities. Students will also perform a 'feelings' role play in front of the class and participate in show and tell sessions.

Other regular activities include literacy rotations focusing on spelling, grammar, reading, handwriting, and sight words.

THE ARTS

Music: Students compose and play a soundscape using words, sounds, symbols, movement and interactive digital media. **Taught by Christina Wight.**

Media Arts: Students also explore the concept of cybersafety and create their own media artwork to represent their ideas about cybersafety. **Taught by Sam Weterkamp**.

Visual Art: *The wonderful world of illustrators!* Students will explore a variety of techniques used by illustrators of children's picture books. **Taught by Bernice Gubby**.

HOMEWORK

Diaries: To be brought to school every day.

Reading: Students to read to an adult at least four times per week. Adult to sign reading folder.

Spelling: To be learned and written four times. Tested on Friday.

Sight words: To be practiced each night. Students will be tested weekly.

Maths: Weekly homework sheets will detail activities to practise maths skills being learned in class.

MATHEMATICS

Number and Algebra:

Model, read, write, and order numbers to 100; Count collections to 100 using partitioning and place value; Solve addition and subtraction problems using a range of strategies; Recognise and describe one-half.

Measurement and Geometry:

Compare and order mass; Tell and write the time to the half hour; and Identify and sort 3D shapes.

Statistics and Probability:

Collect, graph and understand data from simple investigations.

Students will be using Book
Creator on our class ipads to practise their word processing and image manipulation skills. They will also publish their narrative.
